Prof. Dr. Amina Muazzam (Tenured Professor, Director Research) is the Chairperson of the Department and is leading it with a focus on academic excellence. Under her dynamic vision and leadership, the department aspires to meet international standards with an enriched curriculum and cutting-edge research both within and across disciplines. The department focuses on imparting theoretical knowledge with its applications in education and beyond. The courses offered not only foster an understanding of psychological concepts but also cultivate a sense of cultural sensitivity, social responsibility, professional ethics and good citizenship in the students. The faculty members have expertise in a wide range of subject areas, such as clinical psychology, counseling, health psychology, behavioral neuroscience, psychometrics and assessment, developmental, positive psychology, forensic and political psychology. - The students who have passed F.Sc in pre-medical are also eligible (25% seats are reserved for pre-medical students only).

Eligibility Criteria for MS Health Psychology

- The students who have passed BS examinations or 16 years of education with psychology will be eligible for admission to MS Health psychology program.

- Entry test (50% qualifying marks) and interview organized by university is mandatory for admission in MS program.
- All other requirements as per university policy (Please see University admission criteria for MS).

Eligibility Criteria for Ph.D. Applied Psychology

- MS /MPhil in Psychology or equivalent degree (18 years of education) from HEC recognized University with a minimum CGPA of 3.00/4.00.
- Candidates must obtain 70% qualifying marks in the entry test. Eligible candidates will appear for interview organized by the university to get admission in Ph.D. Applied Psychology.
- Candidates working in Government/semi-government institutions have to submit NOC from the concerned organization.
- All other requirements as per HEC rules and university policy (Please see university admission criteria for PhD).
- Admissions in Ph.D. program will be carried out twice a year in spring and autumn depending on the availability of seats.

OVERVIEW

The Department of Economics was established in 1922 with the commencement of Intermediate Classes. Bachelor Level Classes were initiated in 1925. In 1966, Masters Level Classes were introduced as Master of Arts (M.A.) in Economics with the strength of only six faculty members and 23 students in the first batch. Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Economics was initiated in the Department in 1999. The BS Economics (4-Year) program was offered by the Department of Economics in 2005. MS Economics (equivalent to M.Phil.) program started in 2009. Currently, Department of Economics has around 26 faculty members and more than 1500 students are getting benefit from their expertise. The Department of Economics is successfully running the following two Academic Programs.

- BS Economics
 - MS Economics
- along with intermediate classes.

The basic aim of the department is to familiarize students not only with the economic aspects of the modern economy but also with the techniques that help them in empirical analysis of current economic issues and to create ability in them to make judgments regarding public policy. The graduates of the Department of Economics have joined popular careers in ranging from own businesses, banking sector, government departments & agencies, academic profession to research organizations. The Faculty of Economics is keen to follow the teaching methods that encompass both theoretical and practical aspects. OVERVIEW

The Department of Home Economics was established in 1975 at LCWU with Nighat Shah as the first Head of the Department. At that time, this subject was offered only at the Intermediate level. Mrs. Anjum Mirza joined Lahore College for in 1977 as the next Head of the Department. Under her tenure, the subject was introduced at Bachelors level due to immense interest of the students. Initially the course outlined by the Punjab University was followed. After attaining charter, the course was revised and updated. In 2005, a four year degree program of BS (Hons.) in Home Economics was introduced under the directions of the Honourable Governor and HEC. The syllabus was developed in line with the recommendations of the National Committee for the revised curriculum of HEC. Mrs. Abida Talaat took charge as Head of the Department in 2008. The curriculum was updated in 2011 by Higher Education Commission and approved by Board of Studies in June, 2012. In the year 2012, Mrs. Ishrat Azhar took the charge of department. The new curriculum is currently being taught and inculcated from September 2012. Mrs. Yasmin Mudassar took charge as head of department on 4th October, 2018. After her retirement, Dr. Mehreen Ijaz took charge on 6th March, 2019.

Before its formation as a separate discipline, it worked under the auspices of the Department of Political Science (2003-2017) and with the efforts of Professor Mrs. Nayyer Masood Head of Political Science Department, the subject of IR was introduced at bachelor and MS level. Dr. Shabnam Gul joined in 2005 as first faculty of International Relations Lahore College for Women University Lahore. BS International Relations 4 years Degree Program was also introduced in 2005. Currently the Department is offering 4 years BS International Relations (Regular & Self-Support) Program and 2 years MS International Relations (Regular & Self-Support) Program. Besides offering three month short course and One year diploma in International Affairs. Our department offers strong foundation courses in International Relations theories, providing an understanding of current debates in the field and why they matter. We also offer a variety of elective courses, each taught by expert faculty. We span the planet from Asia to the Americas, to Africa, to Europe. In addition, we offer courses in every major theme of IR: Terrorism, International Political Economy, Global Governance, National and Ethnic Identities, Foreign Policy Analysis, International Security, Diplomacy, Human Rights, Media and more. Through, introduction to contemporary analysis of International Relations students will learn major theories of International Relations and apply them to understand International situations and issues in the modern world.
