Research:

Disease Free plants

Efforts to improve sustainable crop development are being spearheaded by a collaboration between Lahore College for Women University and University of California, Davis, USA through Pak-US project to improve the quality and ultimately yield of local Grape plant species. Prof. Dr. Shagufta Naz from Department of Biotechnology is leading many interdisciplinary project among them "Application of molecular methods for the development of pathogen free certification program for grapevine in Pakistan" could vastly improve the national harvest of perennial crops -- from vineyards and orchards. The result will be improvement in crop productivity. A more productive vineyard and orchard industry would provide lower cost, non-imported, healthy food to the people, as well as economic benefit to the growers and to the commercial agricultural sector. Similar efforts are in progress regarding disease free citrus plants.



Public engagement

Department of Biotechnology and Zoology organized three day international conference "New Trends in natural sciences: Public health, food nutrition and safety NTNS-II". The platform was used to develop awareness among public regarding food safety and its nutritional aspect on human health.

RESEARCH

A project led by Dr. Afshan Kaleem, Assistant Professor, Department of Biotechnology, LCWU in collaboration with Prof Dr. Daniel Hoessli from University of Geneva, Switzerland is working on detection of biomarkers in early and late stage breast cancer. The project output will hopefully detect and prevent cancer at early stage thereby reducing the number of breast cancer patients in Pakistan.

Public Engagement

A Diabetic Prevention Camp

A Diabetic prevention camp was held in Department of Biotechnology, LCWU in collaboration with Services Institute of Medical Sciences, Lahore (SIMS). Around 20 medical specialist and dietitians came under the leadership of Dr. Sara (SIMS). All faculty and staff of LCWU were invited to attend for complete check-up. The test performed were sugar test, blood pressure, height, weight and BMI. Furthermore, dietary advice was given by qualified dieticians. More than 150 faculty and staff benefitted from the camp.

Women entrepreneurship

A project led by Prof. Dr Uzma Qureshi entitled "Women Teacher Preneurship: Development and dissemination of entrepreneurship modules for teachers Education programs in Punjab under the theme "Economy: Issues and prospects" the modules are designed to describes the main constraints faced by women entrepreneurs and recommends a number of actions that support the integration of gender.

Training tomorrow's teachers

Post-graduate Diploma PGD is designed keeping in view the recent National Education Policy (2009) statement and the Government of Punjab. This new pioneering program focuses on professional training of prospective teachers in specialized areas preparing them to meet both national and international professional standards for secondary school teachers
