 Only F.Sc. Pre-Medical group with minimum 60% marks and A-Level candidates with Pre-medical subjects and Equivalent grades are eligible to apply for Pharm-D admission on open merit seats as well as reserved seats.

 The Afghan Nationals must route their application for admission through Higher Education Commission, Islamabad within due date.

#### **Terms & Conditions for Reserved Seats:**

 General conditions for admission against these reserved seats are the same as laid down for the candidates applying for admission on merit.

- The candidates from Northern Areas/ Other Provinces shall submit their admission forms against the reserved seats through the Secretary Nomination Board, Northern Areas/ Other Provinces (original letter must be attached). Applications of only those candidates will be entertained, who have passed their HSSC Examinations from a college situated in the respective area.
- Pharmaceutical Industry candidates should be nominated by the Pakistan Pharmaceutical Manufacturing Association (PPMA/ Pharma Bureau). Original nomination letter must be attached. The candidates will have to pay Rs. 82,500/-annually extra, if selected on these reserved seats along with normal dues and fees.
- For Pharmacist's Real Daughter seats candidates must attach an attested copy of Father/ Mother's Registration from The Pharmacy Council. Candidate must bring original Registration certificate at the time of interview.
- University Employee (Teaching & Non-Teaching) seats Merit based within the University Employees.

#### M. Phil Pharmaceutics, (Regular and Self-support 2 years Program)

#### Eligibility Criteria

- Students with Pharm D degree (5 years program) are eligible to apply for M.Phil. Admission.
- The candidate must have obtained 2.5/4.00 CGPA in semester or 50% marks in annual system.
- Entry Test (50% qualifying Marks) and interview organized by University in mandatory for admission
- Candidates working in Government/semi-government institutions have to submit NOC from concerned organization.
- All other requirement as per University policy (Please see University criteria for MS)

#### **Eligibility Criteria**

- The candidate must have 3.00/4.00 CGPA in semester or first division in Annual system.
- Entry Test (70% qualifying Marks) and interview organized by University in mandatory for admission to Ph.D. Program.
- All other requirement as per University Policy (Please See University admission Eligibility Criteria for Ph.D.)
- Admission in Ph.D. program will be carried out twice a year, Spring and Fall depending on the availability of seats.
