History of LCWU

Lahore College for Women University, with a full-time enrollment of about 21,647 students and a teaching faculty of more than 500 members, is one of the most prestigious institutions of Pakistan. It admits students at the Intermediate, Graduate, Master's and Ph.D. levels.

Established in May 1922 as an Intermediate residential college, LCWU originally housed in a building on Hall Road, Lahore, with strength of 60 students (25 boarders) and 13 staff members. By 1950, the college strength had increased to 600 students and shifted to the present building, originally a school, on Jail Road.

LCWU, by 1922, affiliated with the University of the Punjab with an Undergraduate Program in 18 subjects. Within the next two years, the institution had Graduate Programs in 14 subjects. Post-graduate classes in English, were initiated in 1940 and Honors classes in five subjects were introduced in 1949. B.Sc. classes started in 1955 while post-graduate classes in the subjects of Economics and Physics started in 1966. By 1979, Islamic Studies, Political Science and Psychology were, also added to the ever-increasing list of disciplines.

The year 1990, when administrative and financial autonomy was given to the institution, proved to be the turning point in the history of LCWU. On 13 August 1999, became a Degree-Awarding institution. The institution was elevated to the status of a Woman University on 10 September 2002.

At the time of autonomy, in 1990, there were Masters Classes in only six disciplines, but now with the University status, LCWU is offering degrees at graduate, postgraduate and doctoral levels. There is a 4-year B.S. in 46 disciplines, 4 years B.S. professional degrees in Environmental Science, Home Economics, Sociology, BFA Textile Design, Graphic Design, Visual Arts, Interior Design, B.Com, Business Administration, Business Public Administration, BS-CS, B.E. in Electronics, and 5 years Pharm-D and Architecture. The University also offers M.S degrees in 36 subjects. Besides this, the Ph.D. programs in 24 disciplines i.e. Chemistry, Biotechnology, Botany, Computer Science, Mathematics, Education, Applied



Psychology, Islamic Studies, Zoology, Environmental Science, Physics, Political Science, Urdu, Punjabi, Persian and Fine Arts are running successfully.

The 21st century has brought a drastic revolution in science, which has completely transformed the world. Today sciences are exploring areas that defy imagination. Keeping in line with the importance of the sciences in today's world, LCWU has been fulfilling the demand of the female students in the area, as this was the only institution offering science subjects at undergraduate level. This is evident from the fact that majority of the female doctors serving and retired, have at some stage; F.Sc. or B.Sc. studied at Lahore College. Since 1922 the college has proved its worth as the highest seat of learning for science subjects. At present Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Mathematics, Economics, Statistics, Electronics, Environmental Science, Computer Science, City and Regional Planning, Architecture and Pharmacy are taught at Graduate and MS Level in the Faculty of Science and Technology.

LCWU is cognizant of the significance of Humanities and Social Sciences since they contribute to the aesthetic sense of human beings and are essential for the society. The Department of English, being 74 years old, is the oldest post-graduate department of the University. Founded by Prof Ms. U.K. Sirajuddin, it is still rooted in the traditions of scholarship and academic excellence. Besides English, Urdu, Punjabi, Islamic Studies, International Relations, Political Science, Fine Arts, Pakistan Studies, Mass Communication, Gender and Development Studies are being offered at the BS and MS level. The graduates of LCWU take their place in moral, intellectual and professional leadership in all walks of national life. Among its alumni are an extra ordinary number of teachers, physicians and professionals in all fields of life.

(Note) In case any student (only for Arts group) wants to change elective subject / subjects, she shall apply for the same within one week from the date of admission on a prescribed form to be obtained from the Head of Intermediate Office, after that subject change fee will be charge by BISE fee chart. However, the students are advised to choose the group carefully, before applying for admission.

Students who wish to study Fine Arts and English Literature are required to qualify an Aptitude Test on the date notified by the College before admission / merit lists. Students selected on sports seats must take Physical Education as an elective subject.

Students must apply separately for each group if interested because all faculties have separate merit and no form is interchangeable for another faculty. Change of subject possible on merit only subject to the availability of seat.

Admission Rules

Admission to various classes at Lahore College for Women University, Lahore is granted on merit in accordance with the rules and policy of the Government of the Punjab, on the dates notified by the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Lahore. Admission notice is duly advertised in the local newspapers, with the condition that no application form will be accepted after the notified last date. Subsequent to the completion of all the necessary stages of admission, the lists of successful candidates selected on merit, are displayed on the official website. The admission of the student's who fail to pay their dues in time, is cancelled.

Eligibility criteria:

- Candidates who have passed their 9th class in the year 2025 and appeared in the annual exam of the 10th class in the year 2026 are eligible to apply.
- Students who have already passed their matriculation examinations can apply for admission according to 9th class result. However, they must not be registered for or have appeared in the Intermediate Part-I Exams at any Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (BISE).
- Candidates, after securing admissions must qualify their 10th class in the 1st Annual exams of 2026, failing which their admission will be considered cancelled.
- Failing in the 10th class will result in removal from the College Roll's and fee will not be refunded.

Ineligibility conditions:

- The students who appear in the combined exams of 9th and 10th in 2026 are ineligible.
- Candidates who have failed in one or more subjects in the 9th class are not eligible to apply.
- Candidates who passed their SSC in the Supplementary Examinations of 2021 or earlier are ineligible.
- Applicants who have passed SSC (Tech) are not eligible for admission.

O-Level Candidates:

- The students applying on the basis of O-Level are eligible for provisional admission. Their admission will be confirmed upon submission of their complete results and Equivalence Certificate (i.e 8 subjects as per IBCC Rules). The College will register them with BISE Lahore once they fulfill this requirements before the Board Registration deadline.

Application Procedure

1. The candidates are required to fill out online admission forms for F.A / F.Sc. all seats (open merit, reserved and additional seats).
2. Every candidate is required to enclose attested photocopies of the following compulsory documents with their downloaded admission form after the display of merit lists within due date of fee submission.

Documents Required:-

- a. Detailed marks sheet of 9th grade (two attested photocopies).
- b. Board Roll No. slip 10th grade (one attested photocopies).
- c. Result cards of O-Level (two photocopies). Proper Equivalence certificate (Two attested photocopies) must be submitted in the admission office till the admission process otherwise College will not be responsible for BISE registration.
- d. Provisional / Character Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- e. Migration certificate (Original) and two attested photocopies of the result card from the former Board (this condition is for those candidates who have passed their matriculation examination from other Boards).
- f. One photocopy of the National Identity Card of Father and Mother.
- g. Monthly income certificate of Father / Guardian.
- h. One copy of candidate "Bay Form / CNIC" (NADRA).
- i. Six (06) fresh photographs with white background (non-attested) size 1.5"x 1.5".

3. Admission on general seats is granted strictly on merit.

Important Note: -

As per the online Lahore Board "Registration and Admission System" students cannot be admitted / registered with Lahore Board from two institutions simultaneously. Therefore, a candidate have been admitted in any other college of Lahore Board jurisdiction must have to quit that and have her online board registration through that institution cancelled. In case she fails to do so her admission at LCWU would be considered cancelled. If any student wants to quit from LCWU after seeking admission due to any reason she must inform the Principal's office through a written application, otherwise she will be responsible for subsequent complications during her academic session. It is mandatory for all students to fulfill board registration and admission forms (signature, photograph and thumb impression) in Part-I and Part-II if student fail to do so, college will not responsible for any discrepancy in their registration and admission process. Students must check their name, father's name, B-Form number, phone number and date of birth before signing and thumb impression. Students is responsible to pay fine as levied by BISE for any mistake in their registration and admission forms.

Reserved Seats

1. Disabled Student Seats

2% of the total seats are reserved for physically challenged students. Candidates must enclose certificate of their physical disability signed by the M.S. Services Hospital with their forms and appear for interview on the date notified. Physical disability means disability which cannot be rectified by any equipment. Short sightedness and being hard of hearing do not fall under the definition of disability.

2. Sports Seats

2% of the total seats are reserved for Sports basis. Only District / Board level players can apply against their relevant groups.

3. Foreign Students Seats

15 seats are reserved for foreign students must have foreign national passport and CNIC. They will be required to pay Rs. 1,44,000/- along with normal fee for Part-I and Part-II separately.

Important Note: -

Foreign student's fee is non-refundable. It can only be refunded if the name of the student falls on the subsequent open merit list and she does not continue her studies at any other institutions.

4. Minority Seats

2% Seats are reserved for minority students. They must provide their religious certificate at the time of admission/ interview.

5. University Employee Quota

Employee seats are reserved for regular University employee children's only. They must provide their University Employee card and salary slip at the time of admission / interview. Rules and Regulations for employee quota will be followed as per university rules for this purpose.

6. Senior Cambridge / O' Level Students

10% seats are reserved for the Senior Cambridge / O-level students. They will apply for admission along with the Matriculation students. The candidates seeking admission in F.Sc. must have studied Science Subjects in O-level / Senior Cambridge. They must have passed four elective subjects along with the compulsory subjects. The selected candidates must submit their result cards and Equivalence Certificates (Three copies attested by I.B.C.C office) with their forms, otherwise they will not be registered with B.I.S.E Lahore.

7. Additional Seats

Total 30 seats are reserved (5 seats each) for FATA and KPK, Azad Jammu and Kashmir, and other Provinces. Application of these candidates will be entertained only if they have passed their Matriculation Examination from a School situated in the respective area. They should apply through their respective Provincial Govt. Education Department.

Migration

Migration from other cities according to the B.I.S.E, Lahore rules, is allowed only on fulfillment of the following conditions: -

1. Transfer of a parent's job or transfer of residence of parents.
2. The candidate's Matric marks must not be below the College merit.
3. Payment of College dues per annum at the time of migration is compulsory.
4. Students migrating from other cities are not eligible for hostel accommodation.

Important Note: -

The college administration reserves the right to cancel the provisional admission / migration of a candidate, if at any stage after the admission / migration, it comes to their knowledge that the documents presented by her are fake or there is a mis-statement or clerical error in the documents.

College Roll Number / Section Slip

After payment of dues, each candidate is required to see the teachers on duty and get the College Roll No. and Section issued at the back of fee receipt otherwise her admission will be considered cancelled. In case of loss of fee slip, a duplicate can be issued on the payment of Rs. 200/- only. Change of Roll No. or Section is strictly prohibited with no exceptions.

Examinations

The Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education require the students to appear for Part-I and Part-II examinations separately.

All the students of Part-I and Part-II are required to appear for internal Send-Up examinations before the final examinations otherwise their admission forms will be withheld. Monthly class tests are compulsory for all students and their marks will be counted towards the final assessment of internal grading.

The College is authorized to withhold the admission of any student whose attendance is less than 60% or if she is found guilty of gross misconduct. A fine of Rs. 500 will be charge on less than 60% attendance per subject if a student fails to appear in the Send-Up examinations fine of Rs. 500 per subject will be charge.

Medals

Students securing 1st position in the Lahore Board will be awarded Gold Medals by LCWU in their respective faculty.

Leave Rules

1. Leave is granted only in case of genuine need.
2. Leave up-to three days maximum can be granted in a month.
3. Students should apply for leave on medical grounds within a week of falling ill and it must be accompanied by a medical certificate from any government hospital duly verified by the Resident Doctor, LCWU. Leave for more than a month on medical grounds will not be granted.
4. The student must write clearly her Roll No, Name, Class, Section and subjects on the leave application, get it signed by parents and submit it to the leave account incharge in case of three days leave, and to the concerned in charge in case of leave for more than three days.

Attendance rules and schedule of fines for Absence / Misconduct

To maintain discipline and order in the Intermediate Sections LCWU, there is a Proctorial Board comprising the Incharge Intermediate Science, Incharge Intermediate Arts along with Demonstrators to keep vigilance on the campus. Cases of violation of the following general rules of the College should be reported to the Head Intermediate Section who will immediately take proper action.

1. Students are expected to observe strict order and discipline in the College hostel, and the playgrounds.
2. Students should not move about or talk in the verandahs and corridors to avoid disturbing classwork.
3. Students should not enter the Administrative Offices or Staff Rooms without permission.
4. Returning library books in due course on time.
5. Students are not allowed to leave the University premises during academic hours.
6. Students are not allowed to see their visitors or bring them in the College during academic hours.
7. Students are not allowed to walk or chatter near the Vice Chancellor's Office.
8. Students should read the notice board daily.
9. Any student who violates the College rules or involves herself in negative activities like strikes, protests and encourages other students for this purpose or blows crackers will render herself liable for disciplinary action.
10. Every staff member has full right to check students for not observing the above-mentioned rules and any report by the staff members will bring punishment to the defaulters.

11. Students are forbidden to spread by word of mouth or written material, political, religious sectarian, ethnic, regional, or linguistic conflict or hatred.
12. Taking pictures of fellow students or making videos without consent will lead to disciplinary action. Privacy of fellow students should be maintained.

Important Note:-

The name of a student will also be struck off the College rolls due to absence, non-payment of dues or rude behavior. She may be allowed re-admission by the Principal. The fee for re-admission will be the admission fee prescribed in the Prospectus. However, readmission can be granted only once. 2nd time readmission, in specific cases, may be granted on payment of full tuition and admission fee.

Conduct and Behavior

The students of Lahore College for Women University, Lahore are expected to display a very high standard of personal behavior and conduct. The Vice-Chancellor is authorized to take suitable action against unbecoming behavior. All authority regarding maintenance of proper discipline is vested with the Vice-Chancellor, Staff Advisory Council and Proctorial Board. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor in all disciplinary matters will be final and binding on the students and their parents/guardians. She has the authority to suspend, expel or rusticate a student (Day Scholar or Boarder) in the greater interest of the College discipline. However, the defaulter will be given the right to clear her position before the Advisory Council / Proctorial Board.

College Uniform Dress Code

According to the College rules, every intermediate student of 1st shift and 2nd shift has to be in the college uniform. The prescribed uniform is:-

Summer

1st Year • White cotton shirt • White shalwar • Blue sash (college shop) • Black shoes
2nd Year • White cotton shirt • White shalwar • Lilac sash (college shop) • Black shoes

Winter

1st Year • White cotton shirt • White shalwar • Blue sash (college shop) • College cardigan • Black shoes
2nd Year • White cotton shirt • White shalwar • Lilac sash (college shop) • College cardigan • Black shoes

All the students are expected to observe simplicity. They are not allowed loud make-up or ostentatious jewelry. They are not allowed to wear jeans, tights and T-Shirts as well. Students violating the dress code will be fined Rs. 200/- per day.

Cases of violation of the following general rules of the College should be reported to the Head will immediately take proper action.

1. Students are expected to observe strict order and discipline in the College, the hostel and the playgrounds.
2. Students should not move about or talk in the verandahs and corridors so as to avoid disturbing class-work.
3. Students should not enter the Administrative Offices or Staff Rooms without permission.
4. Students must be punctual in:
 - a. Attending lectures
 - b. Paying the College and hostel dues
 - c. Returning library books.
5. Students are not allowed to leave the College premises during academic hours.
6. Students are not allowed to see their visitors or bring them in the College during academic hours.
7. Students are not allowed to walk or chatter near the Vice Chancellor's / Principal's Office.
8. Students are not allowed to celebrate birthday parties during academic hours.
9. Students should read the notice board daily.
10. Students should attend College in proper uniform.
11. Students are not allowed to wear jewelry (real or artificial).
12. Students are not allowed to willfully damage the College property.
13. Students are expected to attend the co-curricular activities. They are not allowed to use video cameras during these functions.
14. Students are not allowed to bring cameras, tape recorders, mobile phone etc. during academic hours. Defaulters will be punished per college policy.
15. Any student who violates the College rules or involves herself in negative activities like strikes, protests or instigates other students for this purpose, or blows crackers will render herself liable for disciplinary action.
16. Every staff member has full right to check students for not observing the above-mentioned rules and any report by the staff members will bring punishment to the defaulters.
17. On the College premises the Principal's authority is absolute. She has the power to impose fine or some other suitable punishment for a breach of college discipline, rudeness to staff, irregularity and disorderly behavior. A serious violation of these rules will render her liable to be rusticated from the College on the recommendation of the Staff Council. These rules are meant to cultivate refined behavior in the students and to maintain a proper, disciplined environment in the College.

International Resource Centre (IRC)

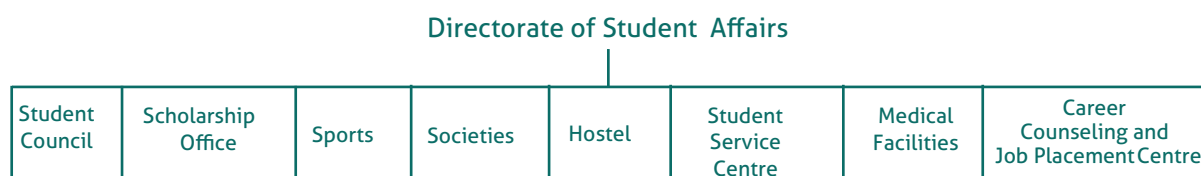

Career Guidance and Counselling Centre

The Counselling Centre of Students Service Centre provides career guidance as well as psychological counselling along with personal growth and development services. Clinical and counseling psychologists are available to assist the staff and students in understanding and resolving their psychological problems. The Centre is also offering psychological assessment services including aptitude, intelligence and personality assessment.

Personal Counseling

The personal counselling and guidance services are available for students and faculty. The following issues can be discussed for personal growth and skill enhancement:

- Familial issues and relationship problems
- Conflict with peers and friends
- Adjustment problem with roommates in hostels
- Career selection
- Stress management
- Time management

Career / Vocational Guidance

- Different psychological tests are used for gaining insight into one's interests, abilities and skills.
- Students are informed about educational programs, professional career plans, and employment and job opportunities.
- Students are guided about ways of accessing information about work opportunities in various career fields.
- Students are helped in career planning and in conflict resolution with reference to the choice of professional programs or career paths.

Health Education Services

Student Service Centre (SSC) regularly organizes health education activities in collaboration with various organizations including Fatima Memorial Hospital, Shaukat Khanam Cancer Hospital and Pink Ribbon Pakistan, and other similar organizations.

Harassment Complaint Cell (HCC)

Lahore College for Women University has established Harassment Complaint Cell in accordance with the guidelines of HEC and also keeping in view the Women Empowerment Package 2012. LCWU is a place where administrators, faculty, employee/staff and students (all levels/categories) work and learn in an environment, free from intimidating, offensive and hostile behaviors. The information and awareness lectures about Harassment Complaint Cell are a regular activity of the HCC.

The students of different faculties of university are guided about the nature of harassment, the process of launching complaint, inquiry process and possible punishment. The information regarding HCC is also displayed on different university notice boards.

Student Gymnasium

The gymnasium is equipped with up-to-date workout facilities and can cater for the needs of 50-60 students at a time. Regular aerobics classes are run by a trained aerobics instructor. The gymnasium instructor is available throughout the week to assist the students and faculty. The facility is open in the evenings as well. For admission and further information, the gym instructor may be contacted on telephone extension No. 258.

Centre for Career Counseling and Job Placement

Overview of the Department

The Centre for Career Counseling and Job Placement (CCJP) has started operation in October 2011. Since then, the Centre is providing counseling to students to select suitable careers. CCJP is assisting students in job placements and skill development. Furthermore, the Centre is preparing students for career success and their role as future leaders by:

- Helping students start their career planning and preparation at an early stage through career and student development programs.
- Soliciting more internship opportunities and further expand the employment network for graduates.
- Effectively improving students in behavior and skills necessary to seek and qualify for job.
- Inviting government officers, judges, women entrepreneurs and members of Federal, Provincial and Public Services for interaction with students.
- Conducting workshop and seminars to encourage students toward public and private employment.
- Training session for skill enhancement and capacity building of the students
- Guiding students choose further higher education in Pakistan or abroad in their study area with the help of Higher Education Commission (HEC).
- Acting as medium of communication amongst students, industries and professional bodies to promote career opportunities for students.

Independent Living Centre

Hostel Rules & Regulations/Fee Structure

Residential Facility:

The Lahore College for Women University offers hostel facilities to the students coming from other cities and abroad. There are four hostels for Intermediate, Graduate, Post-Graduate and Ph.D students. Due to limited accommodation facilities, the students are offered seats on merit only.

Allotment

- Students are required to apply for hostel accommodation on the prescribed admission form.
- Hostel accommodation will be allotted through a merit list. Due to limited accommodation facilities, the hostel seats will be provided to the students only on merit and all other applications will be put on the waiting list and hardship case.
- The seats of quota are reserved as per Government/LCWU Policy.
- Hostel admission is offered for one academic year only, an extension for another year is based upon good conduct and academic performance.
- The hostel accommodation facility will be provided to MS/MPhil and MA/MSc (Self-Support) programs on availability of seats.
- The hostel accommodation facility is not available for diploma/certificate programs.
- Residents who have been expelled from the hostel will not be eligible for re-admission.



Hostel Charges

- The Hostel Supervisory Committee is authorized to give hostel fee concessions/waivers to deserving boarders.
- The Hostel Supervisory Committee is authorized to increase /change/amend hostel charges due to the cost of living/revision of pay scales or other administrative compulsions.
- The Hostel Supervisory Committee is also authorized to waive off Hostel Charges in case of unusual circumstances for which boarders are not responsible.
- Hostel Charges can be increased in unusual circumstances/inflation.
- The hostel dues (Utility Bills, Janitorial Services, and Maintenance) shall be received, quarterly.
- Mess dues and Generator Charges shall be received, monthly as prescribed cost.
- Room cooler charges at the rate of Rs.2200/- per month will be charged in April at the beginning of the summer season, for a period of 6 months/ per month (as applicable).
- Boarders have to pay their fee by the 15th of every month and after the due date, they will be charged a fine of Rs.50/- per day. However, the intermediate boarders are exempted from this provision.
- If a border fails to deposit the monthly dues by the 15th of the next month, she may not be allowed to avail of the hostel facility.
- The mess facility will be suspended due to non-payment of mess dues, with a warning issued by the Hostel Warden.
- The student who does not deposit the fee on time will have her seat canceled and the seat will be allocated to the next student on the waiting list.
- Membership in the hostel mess is compulsory for every resident.
- In case of seven days of consecutive leave from the hostel, boarders can have the concession of a one-week deduction in their mess dues.
- All dues deposited by boarders including the security shall be forfeited if she is expelled on disciplinary grounds.

In/Out Timings:

- Boarders should strictly observe the in/out timings notified by the warden during summer and winter, i.e. 7:00 p.m. in summer (15th April – 14th October) and 5:00 p.m. (15th October – 14th April) in winter, anyone falling short of the discipline in this regard will be strictly checked.
- To ensure security as well as the presence/arrival of boarders in the hostel, they are required to mark attendance while entering or leaving the hostel. The Warden will monitor the attendance.
- Attendance must be observed at the time of breakfast/lunch/dinner.

Gate Passes:

- Self-pass will be issued to all boarders (Intermediate, BS Programs, Pharm.D) by the Warden/Assistant Wardens after written permission of the parents/guardian. Self-pass will be issued to:
 - a. Gate passes are issued to all the boarders by the respective Warden/Assistant Wardens, only on Friday and Saturday, to go home on weekends.
 - b. The borders can go shopping only once a week on Saturday.
 - c. The graduates and the postgraduate boarders for their Research work projects, Field Work, and Internships on the recommendation of the research supervisor and Chairperson of the Department.
- Senior boarders {Ph.D, MS, Pharm-D (V-Prof)} can go out without passes and will enter their name, purpose to go out, time of exit, and entry on the register at the hostel gate.
- Curfew time for senior boarders would be till 7:00 pm for hostel boarders who go out for their research work or internship.
- No boarder will be allowed to enter the university after 7.00 pm.
- Senior boarders {Ph.D, MS, Pharm-D (V-Prof)} will be able to enter the university up to 7:30 pm by paying a fine of Rs. 200/- every time.
- Hostel gates will be closed as per notified timings.
- Failure to comply with register requirements or the curfew regulations may result in disciplinary measures.
- If any boarder has to attend any function/party/trip of the University after the hostel closing time then she will take the written permission of the Chief Warden after verification from the concerned Chairperson of the Department.



Visitors Policy:

- At the time of admission to the hostel, every student's parents/ guardian must provide a list of a maximum of four visitors on the prescribed form giving details regarding name and relationship, copy of CNIC, contact number, etc. This list must be signed by the parents/ guardian.
- The appointment of a local guardian by the parents/ guardian is appreciated who will be contacted in case of any emergency.
- Visitors of the boarders are not allowed to visit their rooms or to stay with them.
- The visitors/guardians are allowed to meet the boarders only during the specified timings/schedule given by the hostel administration from time to time.
- The security guard of the hostel will ensure verification of the visitor and will properly record their particulars in the security register after receiving original ID cards from the visitors which will remain in his custody until the visitor leaves. In case of any emergency, one of the family members, mentioned in the hostel visiting list of the boarder has to come to take the boarder home.

Duration of Boarders Stay In The Hostel:

- All the students who are granted admission to the hostel, their stay in the hostel will be for the duration of their on-campus studies as mentioned in the Academic Regulations.
- Hostel facility will be provided to the Ph.D. boarders initially for a period of 3 years which can be extended up to 5 years on the recommendations of the Departmental Doctoral Committee.
- Every student should stay in the accommodation allotted to her by the concerned authority. She will not be allowed to change accommodation once allotted unless approved by the Chief Warden.
- If there are surplus or vacant seats available, students of MS and Ph.D programs applying for shorter duration can be accommodated, and permission shall be granted by the Chief Warden on a case-to-case basis with charges.
- If the outgoing classes (Intermediate Part II, BS 8th Semester, MS/M.Phil 4th Semester & Ph.D.) vacate the hostel after completing their academic session and come again for practical, viva, thesis work, and convocation. They will be charged Rs. 1100/- per day (excluding mess dues), and if they stay for more than 14 days dues will be charged according to all existing dues.

Punishment:

- In case of any hostel rule violation, the hostel warden will give a written warning to the boarder, however, in case of serious violation of rules, the parents will be informed in writing.
- Any boarder who violates the hostel rules and is found involved in any negative activity like a strike or instigating other boarders for this purpose will be liable to disciplinary punishment.
- The case will be forwarded to the Hostel Students Affairs Committee on the recommendation of the Chief Warden for further appropriate action. The boarder may be expelled from the hostel after three warnings and will not be allowed to re-admission.
- If a boarder extends her leave/stay at home, the parents will immediately inform the concerned hostel warden for such an extension.
- If a boarder extends her leave/stay without informing the hostel authorities. The concerned hostel warden will inform the parents immediately, if no information/response is received from the parents or boarder the case may be referred to the Hostel Students Affairs Committee and the Committee will give a decision as per the nature of the case.

Inspections:

The University or the Hostel Administration can inspect at any time. The hostel premises, boarders room, almirahs, bags, etc. without any advance notice.

Hostel Environment

- Every boarder is expected to maintain peace, tranquility, a calm atmosphere, and discipline in the hostel and respect the rights of others.
- Boarders are not allowed to take their breakfast, lunch, and dinner in their rooms.
- Boarders will take care of the cleanliness of the hostel.
- No one is allowed to misbehave with the administration and employees of the hostel in any situation. Violation may cause expulsion from the hostel.
- Boarders must not disturb or cause inconvenience to other boarders and should ensure peace.
- Smoking, drinking, use of liquor/drugs, and keeping weapons (licensed and unlicensed) are strictly prohibited in the hostel and entail expulsion.
- Boarders should not keep costly items and excessive cash with them. The hostel administration will not be responsible for any loss.
- No political and religious extremist activity or propagation is allowed in the hostel.

Hostel Property:

- Boarders are not allowed to damage the hostel property. Any boarder found guilty will be liable to pay the damage in addition to a fine.
- The hostel administration can impose a penalty if she fails to keep her room clean and tidy. Moreover, if there is any complaint against a room servant, it is the responsibility of the boarder to inform the hostel administration.

Hostel Fee & Security/Refund:

- As per the Higher Education Commission (HEC) approved policy, the admission fee refund will be processed as follows:
 - 100% refund within 15 days of submission
 - 50% refund between 16-30 days of submission
 - No refund after 30 days of admission.
- Hostel security must be deposited at the time of admission to the hostel.
- If the boarder leaves the hostel during a semester, hostel dues for that semester are not refundable.
- A boarder who is willing to leave before or after the completion of their academic session can claim their hostel security within six months of leaving the hostel.
- In case of expulsion from the hostel due to indiscipline or misconduct, security deposits will be forfeited in full.

Clearance Certificate:

A certificate of clearance duly signed by the boarder and their father/guardian is required to be submitted to the concerned Hostel Warden at the time of leaving the hostel.

NOTE: The hostel will remain closed on Eid holidays and in case of any unusual circumstances. In addition, rules and regulations issued from time to time will also be applicable.

Other Dues

- The College fees, hostel fee, funds and other dues must be paid on the dates notified by the College in the National Bank of Pakistan, Jail Road Branch and Bank of Punjab, Shadman Market Branch. However, challan form will be issued by the College office only. In case the students fail to pay their dues within the due date, their seats will be cancelled.
 - To facilitate the students, booth of NBP and BOP are established in the College premises where only students can deposit the dues / fees.
 - If parents wish to deposit the dues, they may contact National Bank, Jail Road, branch after getting the challan form from the College office.
 - Male members are not allowed to deposit the dues at the College booth.
 - The total fee of one year will be paid in every academic year and the names of the students failing to pay the dues on dates notified will be struck off from the college rolls.
 - After payment of dues at the time of new admission, the students must contact the staff on duty for the issuance of Roll No. and section otherwise her admission will be considered cancelled.
- After payment of dues at the time of new admission, if a student pays her dues and leaves the College for whatsoever reason, she will get back the library security only (Rs. 1540/- one thousand five hundred and fourty only) as per rules of the college.

Transcript Fee

Present students or ex-students desirous to take admission in any Foreign Educational Institution are required to pay Rs. 1060/- per copy and then get the Transcript prepared by the Principal's Office.

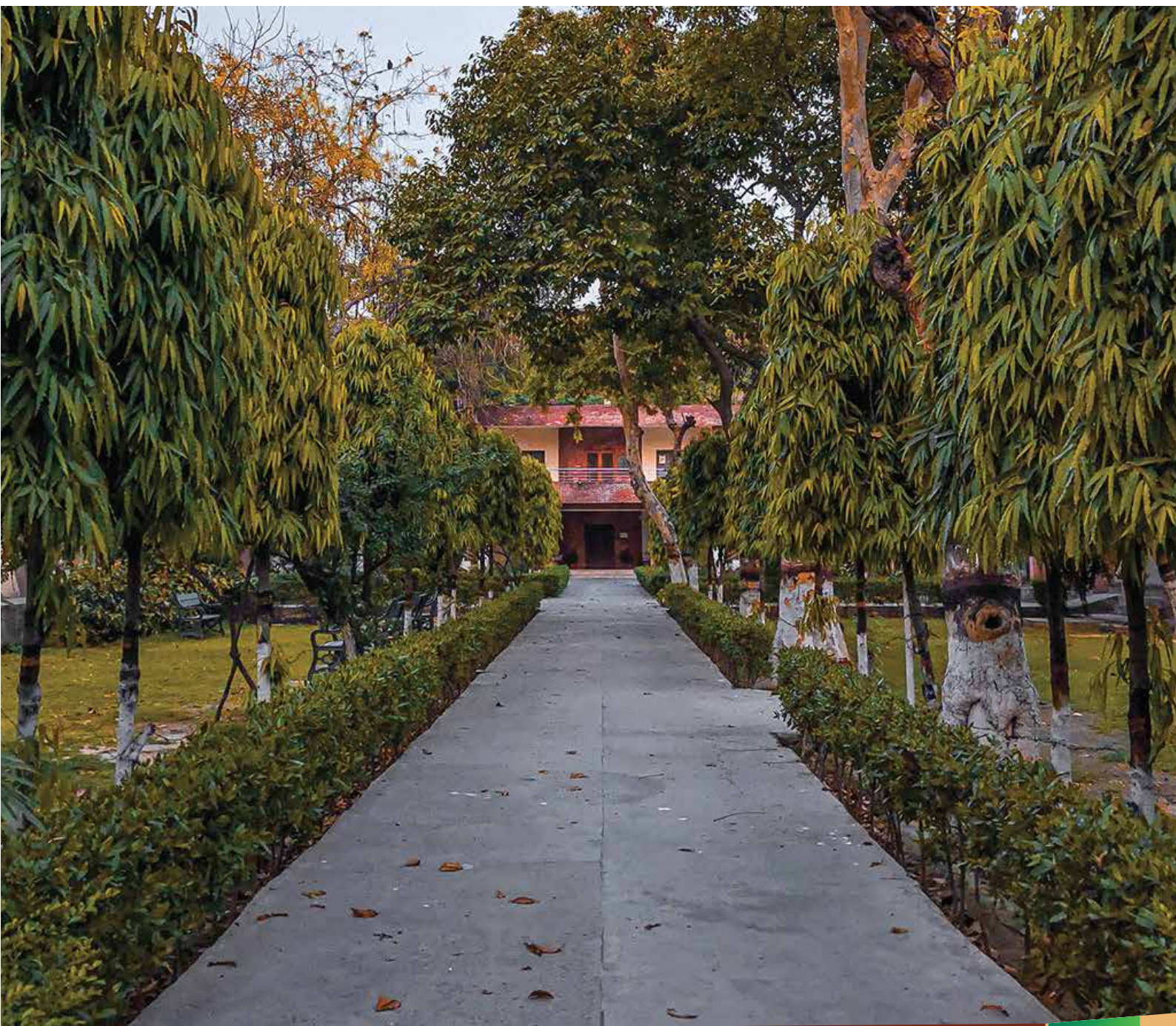
