The infrastructur of University is not sufficient to cater the needs. Therefore there is need of provide additional class rooms / separate rooms for faculty members and computer labs within department specially a separate lab for Ph.D Scholars. Laptops & Tabs should be provided to all Ph.D Faculty Members.

Standard 3.2: There must be adequate support personnel for instruction and maintaining the laboratories:

Department need one lab attendent for cultural lab, and a clerk.

The computing facility of the University needs improvement.

CRITERION 4: STUDENT SUPPORT AND ADVISING

Standard 4.1:Courses must be offered with sufficient frequency and number for students to complete the program in a timely manner:

Courses are offered regularly as per schedule. The degree consist of two semesters regular classes and 6 semesters of Research Thesis and Compulsory Comprehensive exam.

Standard 4.2: Courses in the major area of study must be structured to ensure effective interaction between students, faculty and teaching assistants:

Every course offered in the program carry assignment class presentation, discussion, students introduction to there teachers for the guidance regarding research work

each instructor adopt her own style to teach & guide the research scholars in the class room and during the office hours.

An Orientation class is conducted in the start of every semester in regular classes considered faculty members provide documents continuing programme mission, objects, outcomes, curriculum design and organization, assessment methodology and examination criteria. Similarly the content the document having programme mission, objectives, outcomes available to all students of Ph.D in the module description the same documents shared with the concerned incharge and directors.

CRITERION 5: PROCESS CONTROL

The process of Ph.D Admission based on qualitative values of the students. The criteria is 3 CGPA in MS. No third division is allowed to apply for Ph.D.

The programme has a well define criteria which include evaluation of students marks at different levels. Admission is done twice a year in semester (Spring & Autumn) The students have 3 CGPA in M.S Degree are eligible in the first examination test of Ph.D.

Standard 5.3: The process of recruiting and retaining highly qualified faculty members must be in place and clearly documented. Also processes and procedures for faculty evaluation, promotion must be consistent with institution mission

statement. These processes must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives:

The department has already 8 competent faculty members with huge research work four of them are Ph.D while the four other are enrolled in Ph.D Programme

Standard 5.4: The process and procedures used to ensure that teaching and delivery of course material to the students emphasizes active learning and that course learning outcomes are met. The process must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives:

Process to ensure teaching and delivery of course material:

- Time table is strictly followed by all faculty members.
- The Coordinator of the Ph.D Programme frequently gets feedback from the students during the semester.
- All the relevant materials (Tests, Assignments and Quizzes) of evaluation are submitted to the office of the Punjabi Department. It purpose to ensure that the grading is transparent.
- Award list of all sectionals and final term papers is submitted to the controller of examination.

In order to ensure that the teaching is effective quarterly, survey is conducted by the University QEC and the findings are communicated to the concerned faculty members. After completion of Survey Assessment Team meeting is called to assess the process and make implementation plan for the said department.

Standard 5.5: The process that ensures that graduates have completed the requirements of the program must be based on standards, effective and clearly documented procedures. This process must be periodically evaluated to ensure that it is meeting its objectives.

The program is run on semester basics and at the end of each semester examinations are held to evaluate the students progress in that semester. Qualified students are allowed to join next semester and the cycle continues till the end of the degree program completion.

CRITERION 6: FACULTY
